1. All the members of Joanie's household were on Temporary Assistance until she got a new job and the ATAP case was closed. Joanie's income exceeded the income limits for food stamps. However, since the entire household was on Temporary Assistance, they are categorically eligible and will continue to be eligible for food stamps for another six months.

2. All the members of Freddie's household are receiving Temporary Assistance benefits, and he and his wife, Wilma, are receiving unemployment benefits. In order to save their TA months, they decided to close their TA case and keep the food stamp case open. This family is categorically eligible for food stamps for six months following their TA case closure.

3. Elmer's household was on Temporary Assistance until last month. His new job put them over the Temporary Assistance income limit and so their TA case closed. His food stamp case remains open, and to be efficient, his eligibility worker extends his certification period to end in six months.

4. Dan's new job provides sufficient income to support his household and he requested his Temporary Assistance case be closed January 31. The household continued to be eligible for food stamps during February and March. In April, Dan got a raise and his income now exceeds the food stamp income limit. Because his Temporary Assistance case closed when he was employed, Dan's household is categorically eligible for food stamp benefits.

5. Steven's promotion and raise caused the Temporary Assistance case to close at the end of May. Now that he has more money coming in, he bought his wife a new vehicle in June. Her new car is valued at \$10,000. Since this new vehicle puts them over the resource limit for food stamps, the eligibility worker closes the food stamp case.

1. The Stevenson family is receiving food stamps and they received two CIRI dividend checks. These funds are exempt and should be treated just like the Permanent Fund Dividends. The money will need to be spent within four months of receipt and the household will need to provide information on how the money is spent. These funds will put the household in hold harmless status for up to four months.

2. Cathleen has just received her CIRI dividend. She is so excited that she goes to the bank and deposits the check into her existing savings account. These funds are still exempt in determining food stamp eligibility.

3. Jason decides to open a certificate of deposit with his CIRI dividend because he wants to save the money for his son's college education. These funds are exempt.

4. Esther decided to purchase another vehicle for her family. Normally this would have put the household over the resource limit. But, since she used her exempt CIRI funds to purchase the vehicle, it is still considered exempt. After all, she didn't use any other funds along with the CIRI funds to make the purchase. This vehicle is coded exempt for food stamps.

5. Jamie is 1/8th native and has received a CIRI dividend from shares she has inherited. Her funds are countable because she is not at least 1/4 native blood.
